# How has your relationship with horses shaped your life? By Shari Wolke

There are always things in life that at times make it seem overwhelming. The relationship that I share with my horses, the sense of purpose and commitment to health and training that horses bring to me, make every day with them a stabilizing, solid force in my life.

Probably the most prominent example I have of horses making me who I am-- giving me strength, courage, and ultimately, resilience-- is when, in May of 2015, my Thoroughbred gelding, Kenny, was found to have an infected hock after routine joint injections. What started out as just a lower leg swelling within a week soon became a swollen hock joint with apparent underlying issues. Late on a Tuesday night, I called the veterinarian out because something was clearly going on- more than pitting edema, as we had previously assumed. It was soon clear that Kenny would need to be trailered over to Michigan State. I already knew, as many in the horse world know, what that meant. When a veterinarian thinks that this kind of expert help is needed, particularly with a swollen joint, it's clear that the prognosis is grim. I had also hears the rumors about an infected hock-- that there was really no chance of survival. Loading him in the trailer, my worst fears started to surface, and I was soon physically sick with dread.

For some context here-- Kenny, a Thoroughbred racehorse with 33 starts in his race career, was my partner in the passion that drove me to spend hour after hour, day after day, in the cold, in the snow, in the rain; I spent my life with this horse on days when it was convenient to go to the barn, days when it wasn't convenient, days when I sacrificed time with my family and time with my friends, and days when I thought I was too sick to move. Kenny has been more than just an occasional companion, Kenny has been a daily drive. Molding a Thoroughbred ex-racehorse into, eventually, a horse that went out and earned me my Bronze medal, was not only an incredible experience in itself, but becoming his closest companion over many years had me quite attached.

The first several days at MSU turned into a week. My days with Kenny at MSU's Large Animal Clinic became routine: go to work, leave nearly as soon as that last bell rang, drive from my work in Charlotte, check in at the front desk, change in the restroom right behind Dr. Nichols' desk, walk out that door and into the sterile- smelling, green and white stalled hallway. The worst part of most days of those three weeks was trying to sneak out the big doors leading out to Farm Lane. If Kenny saw me leaving, he would call with a scream that couldn't be more clearly stating, "Don't leave!" When he became the only the horse in the aisle, the screams had me sick with worry. What had me even sicker with worry was the updates from the veterinary team about Kenny's cell counts within the joint: 60,000, 80,000...as high as 90,000 at one point. It was two weeks in when the lead surgeon resident had a serious conversation with us about how far we wanted to go, Kenny's chances with a third arthroscopy, and just how likely it was



# **Midwest Dressage Association Professionals Grant Program**

This Grant program has been established to assist those who are professional members of the Midwest Dressage Association meeting the following requirements in furthering their education in the following area's teaching, training, and judging.

The MDA board of directors shall set aside from the general fund the sum of \$1,500.00 (three grants of \$500 each) at the beginning of each calendar year for the sole purpose of being awarded in the form of Qualified Grant Money to those Applicants meeting the following requirements:

A minimum of 2 years consecutive membership (in good standing) with the Midwest Dressage Association

4 hours of volunteer time documented with the MDA with in the 12 months preceding the filing of a grant application

All clinics, seminars, and educational programs offered and or sponsored by the following Midwest Dressage Association, the United States Dressage Federation, United States Equestrian Federation. And those educational opportunities brought before and approved by the MDA Board of directors on a case by case basis.

Maximum grant to be awarded to any one person shall be limited to \$500.00

\* Board may approve any grant request for less then the applied for amount.

No one person can receive more then one grant per calendar year.

Should said recipient fail to attend specified event all grant moneys are to be refunded to Midwest Dressage Association with in 30 days after the date said event.

Additional funds may be placed and or added to the Professional Grant Fund through donations, fund raisers, etc.

that Kenny would survive.

The surgeon said he had a chance of overcoming this infection, but that it was a small chance, about 40%. We decided to go ahead with the surgery.

After Kenny's third arthroscopy, the surgeons decided to try him on a different antibiotic, enrofloxacin (Baytril). This stronger drug, combined with the third arthroscopy, worked. Two days later, his cell count was 2,000. He came home a few days later, and slowly has recovered to full-time dressage work, albeit at lower levels.

My experience with Kenny's septic joint has taught me so many things: the first is that life is fragile, and that even a minute with your horse shouldn't be taken for granted. This was also one of the few times I've seen my husband cry. You know he's a keeper when he says, after hearing that Kenny had only a 40% chance of making it, "We'll do what we have to do to save him" (As many of you know, a three week stay at MSU with three arthroscopies and several regional limb perfusions- not the least expensive of the possibilities).

I also have gained so much more of an appreciation for the anxiety and stress that others have gone through while having horses. Whether it be dealing with a difficult foaling, an undiagnosed lameness, a surgical colic-- I have so much more empathy for those with horses who have issues beyond our control. Being an L Graduate dressage judge, I now sometimes wonder as the horse goes down centerline-- is this horse a miracle story like my Kenny? I keep in mind the possibility of so much sacrifice that may have been undergone to get that horse there that day. I try to keep riders in mind with comments that encourage and them, while understanding that the horse may have a past as complex as Kenny's. This may be the horse's first show or it's last, and each should be given a fair chance to have a great ride.

I have a new prospect, Shorty, who is a joy to ride every day, and Kenny is now teaching another young rider the ropes of dressage- and loving it. Jordyn is very lucky to have Kenny, but Kenny is also very lucky to now have Jordyn, a rider who clearly has empathy and understanding for her horse and his past. Above all, these are the most important things that horses have brought to my life, and it's wonderful to see Kenny now teaching someone else these fundamental values.
